Summer Time

Summer is a delightful time and so many memories are made during this season. This is a time to unwind, turn on the grill, jump in the pool, go fishing, or just enjoy the beautiful sunshine. Summertime can be fun and rewarding as you prepare to enjoy life and all of the marvelous handiworks of God's creation. During this season take time to journal and reflect each and every day. This summer take time to listen; listen to the birds chirping, the snail as it slithers, children as they play, and more so your own, very own heart beat. For prolonged sun exposure, she recommends "a higher SPF (30 or above) and a water-resistant formulation." She also suggests choosing a sunscreen containing titanium dioxide, zinc oxide, avobenzone or mexoryl as its active ingredient.

The amount of sunscreen you apply is also vital. Waldorf recommends "a shot glass full of sunscreen" "sunscreen people" for the average adult and reapplying "every one to two hours while outdoors." We'll admit that doesn't sound like a fun way to spend your summer, but with these reader-approved products, maybe it won't seem like such a chore. And by all means have fun and smile!
